

I discovered an abundance of core educational value in studying Greek Philosophy through this book. This seems to be an advanced text which has more potency than The Prince, in terms of science and systematic ethical judgement at least.

Professor Wood has produced (so he claims -I don't know German) an extremely literal (faithful) translation of the original. His intent in doing do is "to place the English reader, as far as possible, in the same interpretive position as the German reader of the original." Whatever you think of that philosophy, it results in an extremely difficult text that is of little use to the uninitiated, even for a motivated layperson like myself. The accompanying essays were interesting, but ultimately not why I bought the book.
