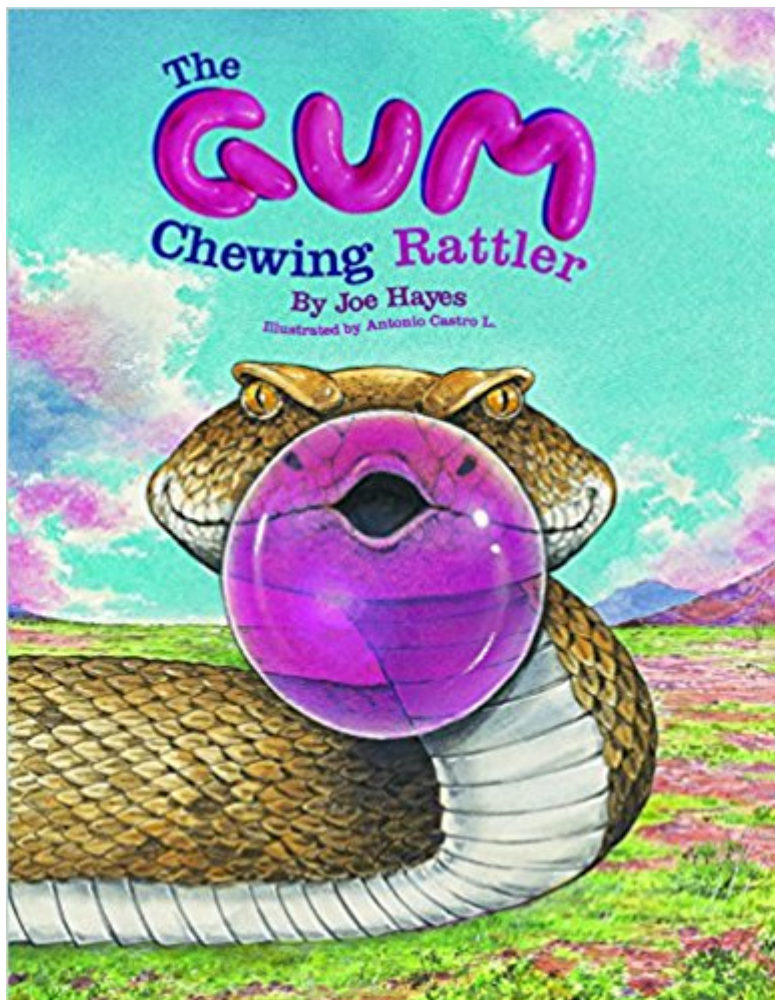

I was looking for a book to read to my granddaughter's 2nd grade class and wanted one that I thought would appeal to both boys and girls. I saw that this book had some good reviews so I ordered it. I have to say I was disappointed. The pictures are excellent but the story is lacking. The beginning and middle of the story are OK but the end is, in my opinion, very anticlimactic. Some reviewers said it was funny but I didn't find much humor. I am a retired primary teacher and have read zillions of books in my time, but this one just didn't make the grade for me.

Students will love this tall tale of a little boy who is addicted to bubblegum and almost meets his fate while walking in the desert one afternoon. But thanks to the spare bubblegum that he keeps in the pocket of his shirt the rattlesnake meets his fate instead. This book leaves your audience sitting at the edge of their seats literally. With one question... Was this really real?

Vividly illustrated, well-told tall tale...or maybe true tale? A boy has a habit of carrying packs of bubblegum in his shirt pocket. One day, out daydreaming while walking in the desert, he steps on a rattlesnake. What happens next is hair-raising and hilarious.

I bought this on a recommendation for a lesson with fourth grade students. Everyone loved this book. The lesson was a success.
