Kate moves into Olivia's absent father's penthouse, with only a housekeeper as parental guidance. The friendship blossoms, until a mysterious man, Mark Redkin, enters their lives. The handsome Mark charms Olivia, but Kate senses that there is something terribly wrong. She discovers that he is a dangerous psychopath with a past as dark and carefully concealed as Kate's and Olivia's. Alternating chapters between the two teens keep the story fresh and make readers feel privy to secrets. Kate's tragic history is revealed with flashbacks. GRADE: A-ONE WORD: creepy (not scary creepy, psychologically creepy)Once upon a midnight dreary,while I pondered weak and wearyBEWARE THAT GIRL evokes the same chills I experience whenever I hear the first lines of Poe's *The Raven*. Although the stories are in no way similar,

Teresa Toten's latest YA novel is that creepy good. Two damaged girls, the wealthy Olivia, returning for her senior year after an extended psychiatric hospitalization and scholarship student Kate, a self-professed liar (and possibly worse) are a perfect storm of a dysfunctional friendship that can only end in tragedy. Add a creepy teacher/fundraiser and you've got a recipe for disaster. Told in Kate's first person POV and Olivia's third person, **BEWARE THAT GIRL** begins with one girl hospitalized, the other holding vigil and a cop with questions about the teacher. But which girl? And to which girl does the title refer? Toten pulled me in and didn't let go with her luscious prose. Can an admitted liar be a reliable narrator? I didn't know. Certainly Kate appeared sincere in her calculating, manipulative plans to achieve the prize, admission to Yale via a friendship with the fragile Olivia. I couldn't help to like and cheer for this unapologetic character. The cracks in her stoic façade and that she genuinely cared for Olivia made her rootable. I never got a true sense of Olivia until the last 10% of the story, but for the ending to work, that was planned. Do wish Toten had given more of each girl's psychiatric history, other than snippets and Olivia's brief report in the beginning. Seeing Kate's, even at the end would have been interesting. My favorite minor characters were Anka and Mrs Chen, and I also wish they had been more fleshed out. Although the plot was implausible, I was still drawn into the story and often felt as if the story could have been possible, due to Toten's writing. The end felt a bit rushed and confusing, which prevented me from giving **BEWARE THAT GIRL** five stars. This isn't a novel for everyone, judging by the reviews. I wasn't even certain I'd like it based on some of my favorite reviewers' lackluster comments. I'm going to reread **BEWARE THAT GIRL** this weekend, after I finish an ARC and I only reread books I truly enjoyed.

Seriously, save yourself some time and start reading in the middle. Everything important gets repeated. This felt more like young adult fiction and I wouldn't recommend it to actual adults.

I almost stopped reading this book before the halfway point. Rich private school girl befriends walking wounded scholarship student. Characterizations were as shallow as...well, the characters. Writing was okay but just okay. Plot seemed tedious. Mean girls fall for sexy administrator. Towards the middle the plot kicked in some more, the two girls developed some depth, and I began to care a little about what was going to happen to them. The ending was satisfying emotionally but way too unlikely and unrealistic. The author seemed to just give up. Essentially the girls' plan had no chance of working and when it did, I felt cheated. This author apparently did no research whatsoever into police procedure or what would have been done and investigated in this situation. The denouement was unsatisfying as well, with no indication what was going to become of the girls. There seemed to

be a hint that they were changing roles but if that is what it was, it was not enough for even a strong suggestion. Okay for a quick weekend read if you're bored, or perhaps for a young adult reader who is drawn to the lives of very rich, spoiled girls in private school.

I enjoyed the book but did not expect it to end when it did. The story kept my attention & kept getting better as it went along.
