

As I read, I could feel myself liking her less and less, and that's not how narrative writing is supposed to work. We're supposed to see her flaws and find them endearing and human. In this latest book, her flaws make her someone I wouldn't want to be around.

Let me start by saying that I am a huge Chelsea Handler fan, and have been for years. I bought this book with excitement, and I was not disappointed. Her style is raw and funny, and she doesn't

mince words. I usually take three or so weeks (reading in the evenings for a short time) to read a book, I'm pretty sure this was completely finished in three days. Her travels to Africa make a great backdrop for her shenanigans, and it was interesting to get to know a bit more about her real life friends. I hope she will come out with another book soon.
