

Sir Edward William Elgar (1857 – 1934) was a popular English composer during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. His most famous works include “Enigma Variations”, the “Pomp and Circumstance Marches”. Many of his compositions are now an integral part of the British and international classical concert repertoire. Elgar is considered to be the first composer to make proper use of the gramophone, and appointed Master of the King’s Musick in 1924. Part is published with last piano page the same as first page of violin part. One binding for both parts, so one has to purchase extra part to be able to read so as to not infringe on copyright. Binding not conducive to page turning.

The bad thing about it is that the violin part is part of the book so you cannot give it to the violinist to play. You have to either photocopy it or buy two of this.
