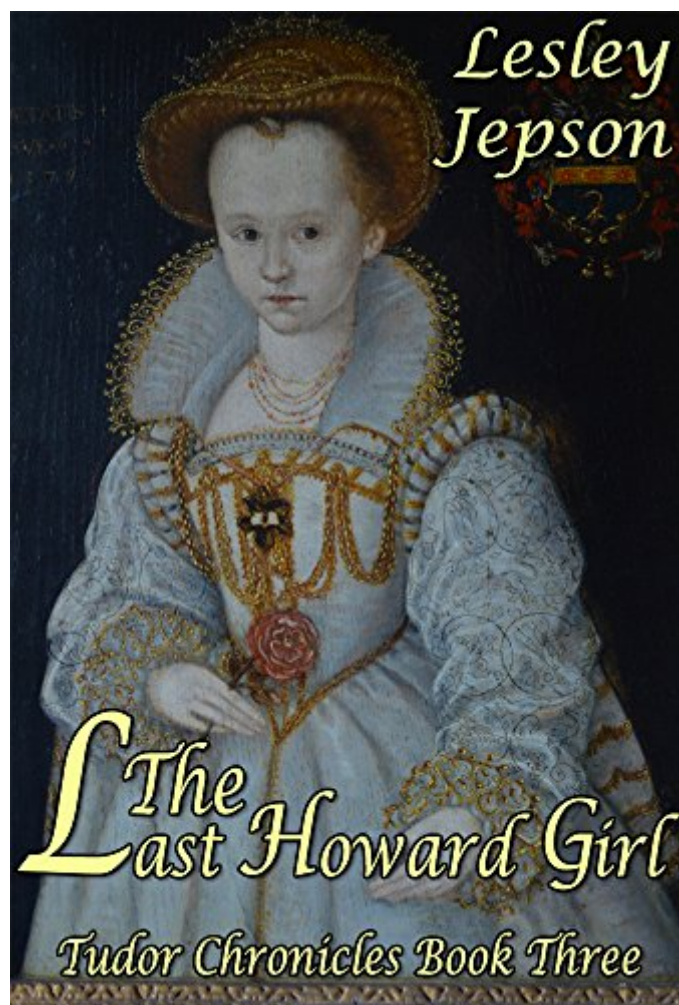

This is a lovely rendering of the romance between Queen Elizabeth I and Robert Dudley, Earl of Leicester. Woven into the story are gorgeous passages describing the elegance and pageantry of the Elizabethan court. The Earl himself is perhaps the most impressive aspect of the book. Although he devotedly serves his demanding queen, he is never less than thoroughly masculine, virile and dominant, a charismatic figure who unsurprisingly commands Elizabeth's love. Engrossing and satisfying.

I found this to be a very brave book. Like many lovers of history, I bought into the idea of the

mythological Elizabeth: a genius who never missed a step. This book shows her to be a real woman with real flaws, one who made mistakes and have to grow into her monarchy. The treatment of Amy Dudley and her role was also very interesting and offered a better explanation for their marriage than any I have read. Although I preferred "In the Midst of Madness" this was a good read and had some great moments. "The last Tudor girl" conversation gave me goosebumps!

Can hardly wait to get to the Book 4. Beside his connection to the Queen Elizabeth, I knew very little about Robert Dudley. I plan on doing some in-depth research of him after reading this book. I highly recommend this book to anyone who is curious and wanting to know more about Robert Dudley, Queen Elizabeth's lover.
