

A great book for a broad overview of the events of World War II. For a beginning scholar or someone interested in the war, this book comes recommended.

The scope of this work is astounding. In particular Keegan's coverage of the Russian front. One can almost envision 3,000,000 German soldiers stepping off the line in June 1941 to invade the Soviet Union. The brilliance of their initial attack combined with the arrogance and inhuman brutality which ultimately doomed it is set forth in astounding detail. There are some omissions. Iwo Jima is not covered at all. The massacres of Jews Poles and Slavs are not fleshed out but the strategic and geopolitical analysis is dead on. The book was published before the ultimate epilogue to the war, the collapse of the Soviet Union, had taken place but the major personalities are all there as well as descriptions of the courage and suffering of the common soldier. To restate the old cliche if you can only read one book about WWII this should be it.

Excellent resource for researching this time period. My professor in my junior year recommended it. The reading is not dry like a text book either.

As a general overview of World War II contained within a single volume, I would heartily recommend John Keegan's *The Second World War*. Keegan has a terrific narrative style that is a pleasure to read. Criticism that the book is Eurocentric seem completely unfair when you look at the entire scope of the book. I would recommend *The Second World War* as a starting point for any casual reading on the subject and it can then serve as a jumping off point for books that deal with parts of

WWII more specifically. I'm glad I bought and read this book.

Keegan's survey of WWII takes the reader from an excellent political, economic and military background to the conflict to a comprehensive overview of the war. Warning: it is not an easy read. Keegan's run-on sentences and confusing misplacement or sudden appearances of pronouns that force the reader to go back to the previous sentences can slow down the narrative. Nonetheless, once over the book's idiosyncrasies the reader is rewarded with an insightful perspective on the war. Probably not read for relaxation but rather for a good history lesson, the book is well worthwhile.

This is my favorite one volume history of world war 2, for many reasons. Primarily, it focuses on the strategic and tactical elements of the war. It presents scenarios among leadership behind the curtain, while still covering the basic political climate of the unfolding events. Keegan takes you inside the minds of Patton, Himmler, Halder, Yamamoto, Tojo, etc, lucidating the undercurrents of the mechanisms of how the war was waged. Breakdowns of campaigns, battles, divisions, battalions and even dialogues between soldiers and generals give you an up front understanding of HOW and WHY the war was fought and thought. With this said, this is not a book for one who doesn't already know most of the political and military generalities of the war. This is a history of the war beyond the "history channel Time life" portrayal, with an insight that forces the reader to ask questions that weren't posed a priori. After the fact, it will encourage the reader to take a more humbled appreciation of the delicate fabric of events in the great upheaval.
