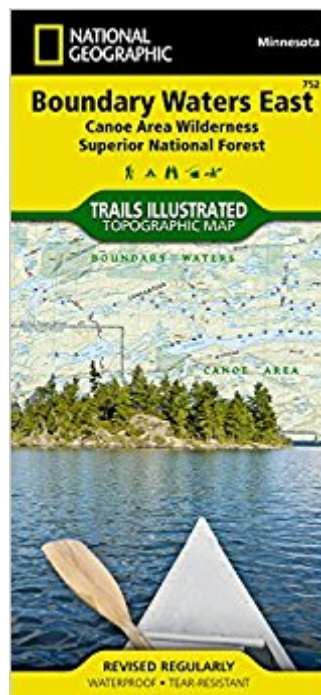

A full UTM grid is printed on the map to aid with GPS navigation.
