

I particularly liked the author's emphasis on the very human personalities and passionate viewpoints held by these farsighted people. I found it enlightening to see how these people were challenged to craft a document that held positive regard for widely divergent political and personal viewpoints,

while trying to address the unforeseen, but anticipated, roadblocks of creating a new country. The humanity of these people, with their faults and foibles, really came through.
