

Stanley's memoir is a fully realized and unflinching portrait of a rock star, a chronicle of the stories behind the famous anthems, the many brawls and betrayals, and all the drama and pyrotechnics on and off the stage. Raw and confessional, Stanley offers candid insights into his personal relationships, and the turbulent dynamics with his bandmates over the past four decades. And no one comes out unscathed - including Stanley himself. "People say I was brave to write such a revealing book, but I wrote it because I needed to personally reflect on my own life. This is the story of a man finding what is important in life, and that came when he finally met his wife Erin, who provided the focus and happiness Paul was seeking. Yes, as a KISS fan the parts about the band dynamics are interesting, if not disappointing when you discover that what appears to be harmony is often anything but. But I found the harsh honesty of Paul's story even more interesting, how he felt let down by his parents, how ashamed he was of his ear, and how he really hasn't had close friends for most of his life. KISS was his life, his life support, and all of us KISS fans are grateful for the time and effort he has spent keeping it going, and ultimately reaping the rewards with a truly killer line up and a new found happiness in life.
